OUR HISTORY

In 1979 Jeri Dulin (Redman), a social worker, and three pastors (Jim Treslow, Jack Hancox, and Glenn Thomas) from local Stafford churches realized there was a growing challenge to provide for emergency assistance and resources for families in the Stafford and surrounding areas.

With a deep understanding of the community and a desire to provide compassionate support they were inspired with a vision for an organized and coordinated effort that could effectively provide for the needs of local Stafford families in need of emergency assistance. The culmination of their vision was the establishment of Stafford Emergency Relief through Volunteer Efforts, affectionately known as SERVE.

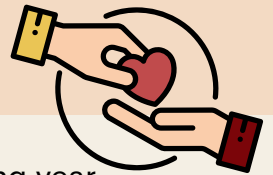


Dear Supporters,

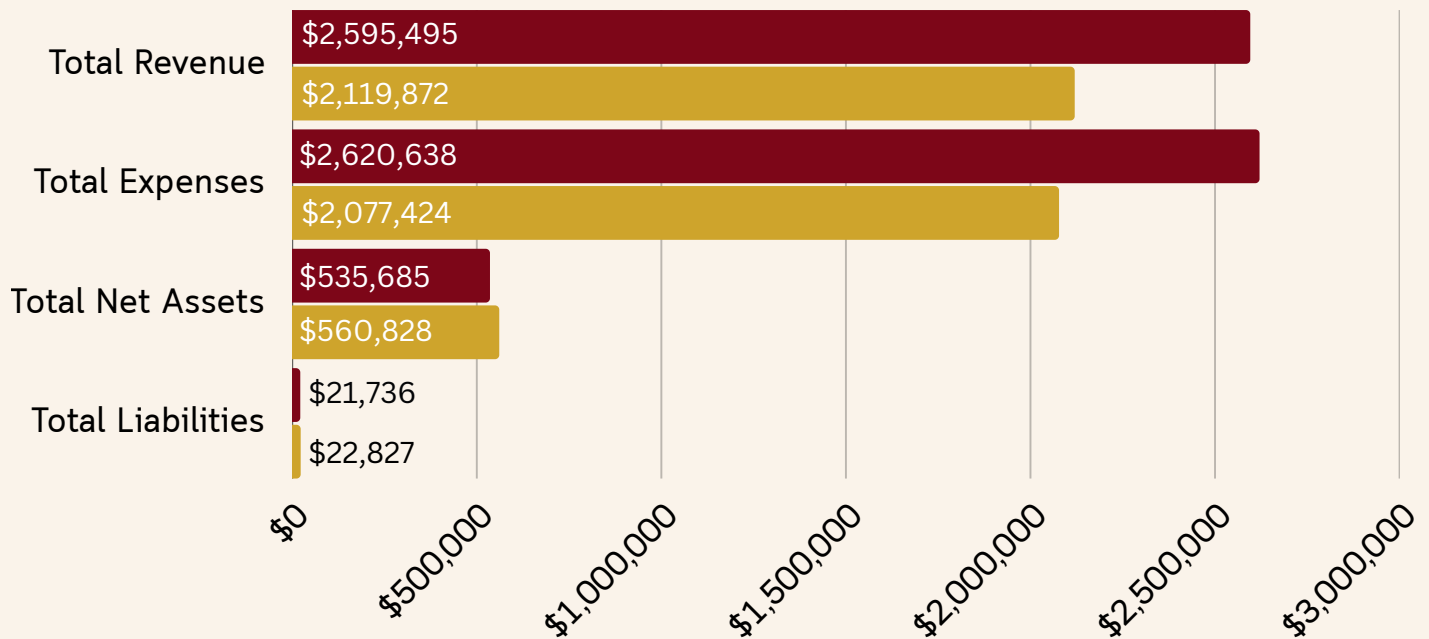

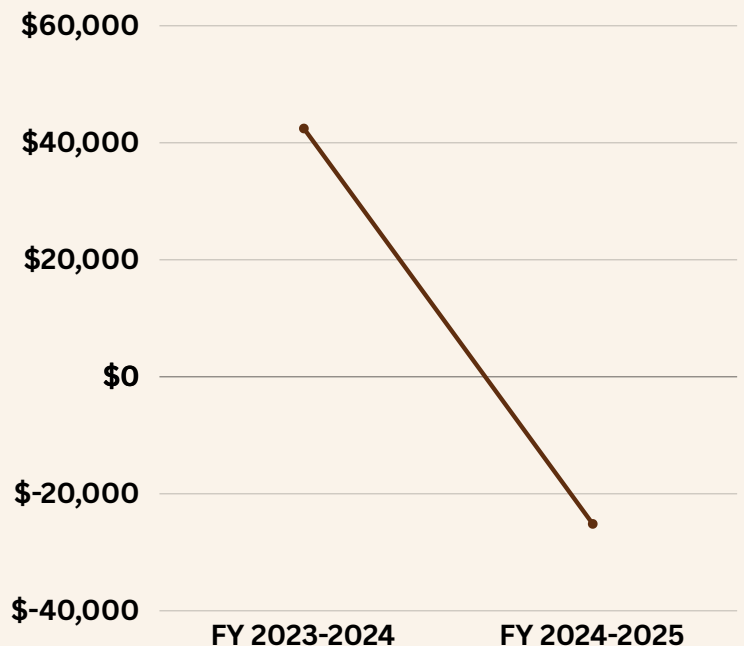


TOTALS
